

# Summertime slides into autumn—and what a summer it was!


Bandon's businesses enjoyed one of the most robust tourist seasons in years, and wrapped it up with a Cranberry Festival many dubbed the best ever.

Public beaches and wildlife reserves offer a wealth of discovery for nature photographers. Easy access to wild places makes Bandon unique in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

"You just set up a tripod, fly a kite and wait for something to happen," said writer and photographer Nick Martin.


Martin produces content for the Bandon Dunes Golf Resort blog and records video documentation of the Oregon coast. He's hiked the 12 miles of beach, from the Coquille River in Bandon south to New River, with only wildlife for company.

"You're less than a mile from the nearest farms, but you feel like you're light years away," he said. Spend an hour, or a day, and document your discoveries at Bandon's wildlife refuges.

Many sea stacks grace the stretch of beach north and south of Coquille Point, including Face Rock and Cat and Kittens Islands, located off shore south of the point. These rock formations are key nesting grounds for shorebirds.

The Bandon Marsh protects the largest remaining tract of salt marsh in the Coquille River estuary. Habitats include undisturbed salt marsh, mudflat, and Sitka spruce and alder river bank communities. These resting and feeding areas are essential for migratory waterfowl, shorebirds, wading birds, neotropical migrants, and raptors.

A short drive south of Bandon, the New River Area of Critical Environmental Concern offers miles of trails, waterways, and beaches. With diverse habitats and waterways, New River is secluded and rich in biodiversity. It's a place where plants and animals flourish and people are only visitors.
