Bandon Chamber of Commerce BOD Elections

Bandon Chamber board directors and committee members provide direction for marketing, membership recruitment, visitor information, and event planning. They also communicate directly with city and state officials to promote business-friendly policy and development.

Our 11-member board is elected by chamber members. Elections are held annually: open positions are announced in February, and elections held in April each year. Bandon Chamber members interested in board positions must be members in good standing for at least one year.

Register board service interest in writing with a letter of petition signed by five other members in good standing. Petitions should be mailed or delivered to the Chamber of Commerce by the third week in March, addressed to the chamber president.

Chamber board meetings are held the 3rd Wednesday of the month. To address the board or request an agenda topic, contact the chamber director at least two weeks in advance. Members are encouraged to participate in chamber committees: advertising, economic development, public policy and Cranberry Festival.
