SEASONAL ANGLING ROUND-UP

Summer Ocean Chinook and Coho salmon fishing are available within a few miles of the shore. Take your own vessel or book a charter. Summer also offers the best weather for nearshore ocean bottom fishing. Rock cod angling is fantastic on the South Coast, with the fishing grounds only minutes from the docks in Bandon.

Pacific halibut fishing is available in the summer months, and bay crabbing and clamming also are very popular. The minus tides of summer reveal some area beaches where you can harvest razor clams.

Albacore tuna travel north along the coast, generally from 20 to 50 miles offshore. Some local boaters enjoy this fishery, but most recreational albacore fishing is done via charter, of which many are available from mid-July through September.

Jetty fishing for perch and rockfish is popular at Bandon, Coos Bay, Port Orford and other ports. The harvest could include a variety of sea perch, greenling, black snapper or even lingcod.

Bradley, Tenmile and Empire lakes offer good summer trout opportunities following spring stockings. Largemouth bass and panfish also are available in these and other area lakes. For a unique summer fun trip, try fishing for smallmouth bass on the Umpqua River near Elkton.

Fall This is a great time to fish for fall Chinook on the Coquille River and other South Coast streams. The Elk and Sixes in Curry County have good Chinook opportunities a little later in the fall and many enthusiasts enjoy fly fishing those streams. Fall is the best time of year to harvest Dungeness crab in the bay at Bandon and in the Empire-Charleston area of Coos Bay. As winter approaches, good numbers of high-quality crab are available for the taking.

Bottom fishing opportunities decrease as

winter nears, but some rockfish remain available into late fall. Area lakes are stocked with rainbow trout at this

time, too, and some bass also are available to freshwater lake fishers.

Winter The winter steelhead run in area rivers is enhanced by hatchery programs and continues to be very strong. Opportunities are good mainly on the north and south forks of the Coquille and on the east and west forks of the Millicoma River on the Coos system. There are many popular spots for boat and bank fishers, and winter is a great time to hire a local guide if you want to try drift-fishing for steelhead. The Elk and Sixes also have good steelhead runs and both are driftable with some bank access. (cont. page 5.)

Summer 2013 Newsletter Contributing Editor, Geneva Miller; Contributing Writer, Steve McCasland Winter is a great time for shellfish in nearby Charleston, with plenty of crab and clams available. Lake trout fishing usually slows over the winter because of the weather, but it still could be worth trying your luck.

Spring Around spring break, the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife begins an aggressive rainbow trout stocking program in local lakes. Bradley Lake is a great place to fish near town, especially now with its newly constructed dock system. It's an excellent place to launch a boat or to cast from the new pier. Empire Lakes also is well-stocked with rainbows and a good spot for family fun.

Fishing for surf perch from the beach really picks up in the spring, with the best opportunities generally from mid-March through May. Offshore fishing for Pacific halibut kicks off at the beginning of May. Recreational boaters enjoy this fishery and charter trips also are available.

A run of spring Chinook salmon is available from late-March through mid-June on the Rogue and Umpqua rivers. Native cutthroat trout

fishing also begins in May in area rivers. Fly enthusiasts and those who may prefer streams over lakes can enjoy this opportunity through the summer months. Anyone who has done it can tell you it's a real thrill to hook one of these natives.


