Expand Market Reach Rural tourism development for Bandon & beyond

If the Southern Oregon Coast is your destination for life, work and play, Travel Oregon's Rural Tourism Studio wants you.

The RTS model, developed and workshopped in other rural Oregon locales, helps local enthusiasts identify, develop and market existing assets with visitor-friendly appeal. RTS workshops start in October 2013 and continue through January 2014.

Regional asset mapping began last spring. Travel Oregon staff networked with business owners and public officials in May 2013 to introduce the studio concept and take note of local input. Attendees at the network sessions nominated favorite haunts, from restaurants to fishing holes.

The emphasis is on development, not reinvention.

Outdoor enthusiasts are multi-dimensional tourists.

According to a study commissioned by Golf Digest, golfers shop as often as non-golfing tourists; and they are more likely to seek out fine dining, performing arts and local sightseeing experiences. A survey of visitors to Bend, Oregon during a national cycling tournament showed tournament attendees enjoyed additional outdoor sports such as rafting, kayaking and canoeing. Many also visited local breweries.

Travel Oregon facilitator Kristen Dahl reminded participants that the studio aims to protect and celebrate rural Oregon's unique character. Research by the Oregon Tourism Commission shows travelers look for unique local culture and delight in the same experiences as residents—familiar cafés and u-pick farms offer the thrill of discovery for visitors.

Product development is the goal, and each community has to leverage that product, explained Julie Miller, director for the Bandon Chamber of Commerce. Those acquainted with RTS projects in other towns will note a new spin on the local studio, which includes residents from Bandon to Brookings.

"It's great networking and an opportunity to link the region in a way we haven't tried before. This gives Bandon business owners a platform to explore ideas they might not have thought related to their business," said Miller. "We can partner and build relationships regionally and expand market reach beyond Bandon."

Regional assets identified last spring include culinary arts and agriculture, cycling and naturebased recreation.

Of course, visitors do more than eat and enjoy the great outdoors. They also seek entertainment, shopping and lodging options. RTS facilitators are recruiting a cross section of community participants: community leaders; business entrepreneurs; tour guides, outfitters and operators; lodging property owners; farmers, ranchers, and land managers; outdoor enthusiasts; restaurateurs; event producers.
