Santa Claus is Coming to Old Town

How does Santa Claus get to Bandon? By boat, of course!

Kids of all ages are invited to celebrate the holiday season at the Old Town Marketplace on the Bandon waterfront. Meet local farmers, fishermen, chefs and artisans at the big green building on Saturday, December 8. The Marketplace opens at 10 AM, with Santa the guest of honor.

Santa has been a regular holiday visitor in recent years, courtesy of Prowler Charters. He always makes a splash, in his bright red suit and windswept beard. Join Santa at 1 PM at the 1st Street boat launch. The jolly old elf will stroll through Old Town, then to the Old Town Marketplace for photos with Cardas Photography. (If the weather is frightful, head straight to the Marketplace.)

The Port of Bandon launched the Old Town Marketplace this spring. Through the harvest season, shoppers found regional produce in every color of the rainbow, picked just hours before market. According to Port Manager Gina Dearth, the response from the public and the vendors has exceeded her wildest expectations. While the majority of vendors live in Coos and Curry Counties, some trek to Bandon from as far as Portland and Klamath Falls. In a time of economic stress, Dearth said the Marketplace has proven a successful venue for farmers and artisans to share their products and meet new customers.

"I had no idea it would be like this," said Dearth. "It's been a win-win."

Port staff extended the market season to accommodate the many artisans who expressed a desire to participate. "What better time than the Christmas season to offer an opportunity for new vendors to meet and share their wares?" asked Dearth.

If you haven't stopped by the big green building lately, December 8 will be your last chance—until April. This winter, the Port will oversee continued improvements to the building in anticipation of a great 2013 market season.

The BCC is one of many organizations working with Oregon Parks and Recreation to help keep Oregon beaches safe, clean and beautiful. The Parks department has warned coast residents to expect an increase this winter in ocean debris from the 2011 tsunami in Japan.

Parks officials encourage beach goers to remove and recycle small debris. If you see a significant amount of debris, debris with living organisms on it, or an item that appears hazardous or too large to move by hand, report it by email with the date, location and photos to beach.debris@state.or.us.

Debris reports of all kinds can also be made by phone. Call 211 (800-SAFENET).

Learning in Real Life

Margaret and her husband Steve Pounder are owners of two Old Town businesses, Bandon Fish Market and Bandon Coffee Café. Pounder describes herself as a full time student, always evaluating what's working in her business and how she can improve her customers' experiences.

Margaret and Steve purchased Bandon Fish Market more than ten years ago. The little blue building on the waterfront was already a destination for fish and chips. The couple recognized they could not grow the business without literally expanding the physical space. They added 20 square feet to the Fish Market in 2011. The remodel included expanded

kitchen space, a new restroom and an indoor dining area for customers. What didn't change? The line of customers stretching outside the market door, evidence that the signature fish batter recipe created 28 years ago by founder Jim Wise still hits the spot.

Before she started selling fresh fish and locally roasted coffee in Bandon, Pounder lived in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Between 1976 and 1992, Pounder's travel company, Time to Travel, grew to employ 31 professionals in four offices. She was active in the Coeur d'Alene Area Chamber of Commerce and was elected as first woman president of the 73-year-old organization.

Pounder, along with Steve and their family, joined livestock farmers on the leading edge of agricultural industry in 1993. Through the 1990s, she served on the board of the Northwest Emu Association, was elected president of the National Emu Association and worked as the association's executive director.

Looking Ahead

For all of her organizational and business experience, or perhaps because of it, Pounder conveys confidence in other's professional competence. And she's ready to recruit new and young business professionals to help shape the future of the Bandon Chamber.

"They need to take hold of this village and guide it to its next level," she said.

She met with one of the region's new faces over coffee at the café recently. Marc Hinz is the new director for the Oregon Coast Visitor Association. Pounder took advantage of Hinz visit to Bandon to learn more about OCVA and ask Hinz how Bandon business owners can best access the organization's resources.

"Schallert is a down-to-earth, nuts and bolts instructor," said Pounder. "He's not a motivational speaker. For 30 to 40 minutes of your time, you can learn something that might help your business."


